

Format/Grammar Guidelines

- Follow the Associated Press (AP) Stylebook's guidelines for grammar and mechanics.
- Below are six key AP style guidelines; reference the <u>OWL Purdue Online Writing Lab</u> for other rules.

Dates	Use numerals for days without st, nd, rd or th	August 9, not August 9 th

Commas	 In lists of three or more items, do not use a comma before the conjunction Exceptions are made if the elements in the series are complex phrases or if the series includes an element with a conjunction 	 The intercity rail will feature drinks, snacks and wifi. Capitalization	 Words are all lowercase unless a specific rule says to capitalize them, such as proper nouns Seasons and directional indicators (such as east and west) should only be capitalized when used in a proper name or to refer to specific geographic regions 	 There are 32 directors serving on the Front Range Passenger Rail District Board of Directors The passenger rail would run north- south along the Front Range, down to Southern Colorado.
