Where Are We Now?

Service Development Plan

- Completed at end of 2025
- Alternative Analysis due at end of 2024
- Will provide FRA and RR partners the details needed for ongoing discussions around:
 - 30% design for infrastructure costs for the corridor
 - Station location and development (future station development is District responsibility post SDP)
 - Access agreements for service on BNSF and UP tracks
- CIDP


Peak Service Study

- RTD about to present final report to the RTD Board in Sept/Oct.
- Provides data on PSS scenario: 3RTs in am and 3 RTs in the pm, nine commuter rail stations, 30% design on PSS infrastructure

SB184 Collaboration

- Goal = provide messaging to public in northern section of the District how, when, where trains could run in the future between DUS and Ft Collins.
- District, RTD, CDOT discussing service options for trains from DUS to Fort Collins
- Discussions are state/local level and outside of official planning process





Colorado SB 24-184

- Discussions around northern portion of project Denver to Fort Collins
- Funds from new assessed fees go to CTIO (within CDOT) for bus and rail services
- Fees allocated to finance capital infrastructure late 2025
- Capital needs dependent upon negotiations with the RRs and environmental clearance (3-4 years); independent utility projects
- Identify needs for project
 - Address challenges around FasTracks
 - Collaboration between District, RTD, CDOT
 - District = do no harm to future political messaging and voter prospects
- FISA discussion Funds are for "unfinished business" -RTD board vote





RTD Peak Service Study Completion

FRPR and RTD

- RTD is working on the NWR Peak Service Study (PSS) to evaluate commuter rail service feasibility between DUS and Longmont, operating along existing B Line tracks
- Presentation to RTD board in September
- BNSF capital cost numbers could inform FRPR discussions
- Began discussions with FRPR on joint operations on BNSF track north of Westminster



SB24-184 Collaboration

FRPR, RTD and CDOT

- Met with facilitator to discuss the 184 process and requirements
- Operations, Finance and Governance committees among agency participants and governor's office
- Currently looking at reporting requirements, governance model, and joint operations scenarios in preparation for Transportation Legislative Review Committee report at the end of September







SB24-184 Collaboration

FRPR and RTD

- Explored options on the use of shared platforms at Boulder and Longmont stations
- Cost-sharing on track improvements,
 PTC implementation, maintenance costs
- Joint use/cost of vehicle maintenance facility and storage yard
- Similar vehicle type

FRPR and CDOT

- Discussions around how SB184 fits into the existing planning process and how it informs it.
- Modeling around service scenarios up north to integrate station area discussions.
- Technical workshops scheduled to examine and formalize service scenarios, including weekly meetings of the Joint Operations Working Group.
- Discussions on fee revenue financing capital construction early in the project cycle.
